## Nova Teachers/Guides/Directresses

It was a wonderful time to connect to our fellow Montessori teachers and to take part in some amazing workshops with speakers from around the world. We
examined different aspects of what learning in community means in the context of centres and schools who espouse Montessori's approach to life and learning.

With the excitement and the nourishing from the conference the teachers arrived back at school ready to begin the term with a renewed enthusiasm and commitment to the children and families they serve.

## Kauri 6 to 9 Learning Community Morning Programme

- Three Hour Work Cycle (all school days)

In the 6-13 classrooms the children's Three Hour Work Cycle begins at 8:30 AM, when school starts for the day.

As well as a continuation of the work cycle in some of the afternoon programmes each class offers an opportunity to focus on:

## Kauri (6-9) Afternoon Programme

## Monday:

- Spelling and Whole Language Focus
- Reading Groups

Could the children please bring their reading folders and spelling books each Monday, where they will receive new reading books and spelling words for the week.

## Tuesday:

- Fortnightly Art Focus (relating to "Story.")
- A monthly visit to New Brighton Library to gather books for the classroom and the children's personal research projects.


## Wednesday:

- Permaculture Gardening with Lily White will be offered every second Wednesday. And Creative Writing

Wheelie Wednesday lunchtime is a great opportunity for the children to bring along their scooters, skateboards, roller blades etc. Unfortunately due to safety reasons bikes are not permitted.

Thursday:

- Quiet Reading/ Creative Writing
- Singing with Rachael, (Reilly and Israel's mum) will be guiding and sharing her musical talents with the children through song. ©

Friday:

- Kiwisport (weather permitting). Julie will support the children in a varied winter sport programme of small ball skill games, netball and hockey and a selection of Kiwidex Games. Please ensure your child has suitable shoes and clothing for this day.
- Gymnastics will continue in Term 3, and in Term 4 a variety of summer sports will be offered and a Jump Rope for Heart Skipping Programme.

The children's swimming lessons and a zumba dance programme continues at Jellie Park for all primary classes on the week of Tuesday, June $4^{\text {th. }}$

## Cosmic Education in Kauri Room (6 to 9)

Throughout last term the children were offered story and presentations on:

- A Story of the Formation of the Universe and Earth
- A Story of the Coming of Life
- The Animal Kingdom
- A Story of the Coming of Language

This term the children will be learning about:
The Story of Numbers, also called the History of Mathematics and Geometry This lesson begins with the earliest civilizations, which often only had "one", "two", and "more than two" as their numeric system. It continues with a look at different numbering systems throughout the centuries, culminating in the decimal system that we use today.

## Cycle Safe:

- We would like to offer the Cycle Safe programme on the $29^{\text {th }}$ and the $30^{\text {th }}$ of May (two weeks) through the Christchurch City Council Cycle Safe
Programme. It will involve an introduction to the programme, biking skills, road rules and biking on the asphalt and on the road. (Separate notice)


## Cosmic Education in Pohutukawa Room:

Cosmic Education provides the context for the children's learning while enabling them to have the opportunity for deep inquiry about everything there is in the universe with all the interconnection and relationships.

The Sumerians developed mathematics as a formal area of teaching and learning about 5,000 years ago. They did this at the same time as they developed reading and writing. However, the roots of math go back more than 5,000 years and this term we will be exploring the history of math.
"All things are a part of the universe, and are connected with each other to form one whole unity." Maria Montessori

## Going Out:

Dr Montessori saw a need for the primary aged child to "go out" into the community as part of their learning. Children of this age might think, "I want to understand what I cannot see, and be part of the world I have not experienced."

This term our "Going-Out" excursions will be initiated, planned, organized and carried out by the students as planned and at times spontaneous extensions of projects or studies that they are individually pursuing in the class. The children will be supported and guided through this process by Paula. We look forward to having a scheduled event soon.

The students will be experiencing Nature-Based Learning in the outdoor environment. We will be using our own school gardens, the estuary, forests and beach to understand and connect to the many facets of living and non-living things. The aim is to see the connection to the natural world and develop a personal and social responsibility to it.

- The annual (9 to 13) camp will be in Term 4 from Monday, $18^{\text {th }}$ until Friday $22^{\text {nd }}$ November at Raincliff Scout Lodge South Canterbury.

## The Three -Hour Work Cycle

What Dr Montessori knew through systematic observation and the genius of insight, and what we have practiced worldwide for a century, now finds verification by psychology and neuroscience. Year by year the repository of evidence accumulates, verifying the basis of the "Montessori Method" and detailing neurologically and psychologically why this approach to "learning" works so venerably for children. As well, the evidence confirms the essential value of the uninterrupted three-hour work cycle.
